

GUN RANGE RULES - SAFETY IS OUR #1 PRIORITY

You never fool around or play with guns. Guns are dangerous when they are not handled or used properly and can easily injure or kill you, and those around you. There are no second chances with a gun and the rules for safe gun handling must always be followed to avoid accidents.

- 1. Know and follow all the rules of the Gun Range.
- 2. Listen and do what the Range Master tells you to do.
- 3. Uncase and case your gun at the shooting bench, never behind the safety line.
- 4. Always keep firearms pointed in a safe direction.
- 5. Treat all firearms as if they were loaded.
- 6. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to fire.
- 7. Keep your firearm unloaded until you are ready to fire.
- 8. Dry firing is allowed on the firing line only.
- 9. Keep your firearm always pointed down range.
- 10. No drawing from a holster.
- 11. Do not pass a loaded firearm from one booth to another.
- 12. If a jam or other malfunction occurs and you cannot clear the problem, leave the firearm on the shooting bench and ask the Range Safety Officer for help.
- 13. Do not leave the firing line with a loaded or jammed firearm.
- 14. Report any negligent discharges or damage to equipment immediately.
- 15. If a cease fire is called, unload your firearm with the cylinder open or action locked back and step back from the shooting position.
- 16. No photography in the gun range without permission.
- 17. Never move forward of the firing line or shooting booths.
- 18. Eye and ear protection is mandatory before entering the range.
- 19. Shotguns may use slugs or buckshot only.
- 20. Do not crossfire at targets on other lanes.
- 21. Smoking, eating, or drinking is prohibited on the range.
- 22. Anyone displaying unsafe actions will be warned to correct their behavior and/or be asked to leave.
- 23. Max Creek refuses the right to refuse use of the range or service to any persons for any reason.
- 24. No tracer, armor piercing, steel core, reloads or shotshells allowed.
- 25. No one under the age of 18 is allowed on the range without parent or legal guardian supervision.
- 26. Children must be at least 14 years of age to shoot.
- 27. Never use alcohol or drugs before or while shooting.
- 28. No pregnant women are allowed on the range.
